



# 1 Basics

## 1.1 Device overview





### Back button

- Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

### Home button

- From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Touch and hold to turn on Google Assistant. You can get help such as getting directions and restaurant information based on the content detected on the screen.

### Recent apps

- Touch to view applications you've recently accessed

### Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from **Power off/Restart/Airplane mode**.
- Press and hold the **Power** key and **Volume down** key to take a screenshot.
- Press and hold the **Power** key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.
- Double-press the **Power** key to open the camera.

### Volume Keys



- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the media volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In camera preview mode, press the **Volume up** or **down** key to take a photo or press and hold to take burst shots.

## 1.2 Getting started


### Setting up

#### Inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card


- 1 Insert the provided SIM pin into the hole.
- 2 Pull out the SIM tray.
- 3 Place the SIM card or microSD card into the tray slot and carefully close the SIM tray.



Single-SIM devices only




Dual-SIM devices only



You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card as this phone supports hot swap.

 Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types; otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

### Charging the battery



You are advised to fully charge the battery (  ). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

### Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, PIN, Password, Pattern, Fingerprint or Face unlock) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network carrier. Be sure to keep your PIN code secure.

### Powering off your phone

Press and hold the **Power** key until options appear, then select **Power off**.

## 1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, and folders) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** button to switch to the Home screen.



### Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the notification panel

### Search bar

- Touch ① to enter text search screen
- Touch ② to enter voice search screen
- Touch ③ to enter camera translate screen


Touch an icon to open an application, folder, etc.

### Favorite tray applications

- Touch to enter the application.
- Touch and hold to move or remove applications.

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

## Using the touchscreen



To access an application, touch it with your finger.



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example. Select a contact in Contacts and touch and hold it. An options list will then appear.



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.




Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can slide the screen horizontally too.



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.



Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better screen view.

## Status bar


From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notification information.

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the quick settings panel.

Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, they can be accessed by touching them.

## Notification panel

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.



Touch to access **Settings**, where you can set more items.


Touch to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

## Quick settings panel

Touch and drag down from the top of the screen to open the Quick settings panel.

You can enable or disable functions or change modes by touching the icons.

Touch the **Edit** icon  to customize your Quick settings panel.



Touch to customize your Quick settings panel.

## Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the screen with a pattern, PIN, password, fingerprint or face.


To create a screen unlock pattern, touch **Settings > Security & biometrics > Screen lock, Fingerprint or Face unlock**.

### To lock the phone screen

- If your phone remains inactive for a period of time, it will automatically lock the screen and enter sleep mode to save power. Go to **Settings > Display > Sleep** and select a screen timeout period.
- You can also manually lock the screen by pressing the **Power** key once.

## To unlock the phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, swipe up and unlock the screen with the method you have set.



## Enter a password to unlock the screen

Once the screen is turned on, swipe up from any position on the screen to display the password input panel. Then enter your lock screen password.

## Use pattern unlock

Draw the same pattern you have set to unlock the screen.

## Use Face unlock

- From the app list, touch **Settings > Security & biometrics > Face unlock**. Before using the face key, you need to set a pattern/PIN/password.
- Hold your phone 20-50 cm from your face. Position your face in the square shown on the screen. For best results, we suggest that the face key is enrolled indoors and away from direct sunlight.

## Use Fingerprint unlock

- Touch the fingerprint sensor (**Settings > Security & biometrics > Fingerprint**) with an enrolled finger to unlock the screen.

## Personalizing your Home screen

### Add

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a shortcut and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

### Reposition

Touch and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

### Remove

Touch and hold the item and drag it up to the top of the  $\ominus$  remove icon, and release after it turns red.

### Create folders

To improve the organization of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

### Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen, then touch **Wallpapers** to customize wallpaper.

## Shortcuts and recently used applications


### Consult shortcuts

Touch and hold the empty area in the Home screen, then touch **Shortcuts** to display all shortcuts.

Touch and hold the selected shortcut and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

### Consult recently used applications


To consult recently used applications, touch the **Recent apps** button. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it right to close the application.

Touch **Clear all** at the bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.

## Volume adjustment



Press the **Volume** key to adjust the Media volume.

Touch the  icon to adjust Ring, Notification, Media and Alarm volume.

## 1.4 Text input

### Using the Onscreen Keyboard


#### Onscreen Keyboard settings

Touch **Settings > System > Languages & input**, touch the Virtual keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.

#### Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust it by changing the settings (Touch on/off **Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen**).



### Text editing


You can edit text which you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double touch within the text you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the amount of text to edit.
- The following options will appear: **Cut**, **Copy**, and **Share**.



You can also insert new texts if preferred

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank area. The cursor will blink and the tab will appear. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show the **Paste** and **Select all** option which allows you to complete pasting immediately.



## 2 Multimedia applications

### 2.1 Camera



Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

#### Launch Camera

There are multiple ways to open the Camera app.

#### From the Home Screen

From the Home screen, touch **Camera**

#### From the Lock Screen

When the screen is locked, press the Power key once to light up the screen, then swipe left on the camera icon in the lower right corner to open the camera.

#### Using a shortcut key

Simply double-press the **Power** key to open the camera.



#### 1 Flash mode

Touch to turn on/off the camera flash

**WARNING:** Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash toward people's or animals' eyes.

#### 2 Take a timed photo

#### 3 Take HDR photos

#### 4 Zoom in/out

#### 5 Switch between front/back camera

#### 6 Take a photo

#### 7 Touch to access settings

#### 8 Picture size

#### 9 Pinch fingers together to zoom out, or spread fingers apart to zoom in

#### 10 View the photos or videos you have taken

#### To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary. Touch to capture. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also touch and hold to take burst shots.

#### To take a video

Touch **VIDEO** to change the camera mode to video. Touch to start video recording. Touch the left part of this icon to take a picture during video recording.

Touch the right part of this icon to pause video recording and touch to continue. Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

## Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch , then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch **Back button**  to return to **Camera**.

## Modes and settings

### Modes

Slide left or right to switch between modes.

- **AUTO**: Auto is the default mode for Camera.
- **VIDEO**: Touch to access video mode.
- **FILTER**: Touch to select filter.
- **PANO**: Touch to turn on the panorama function. Touch the shutter button to start taking a panoramic photo and move the phone steadily along in the direction indicated by the onscreen line. Once the slots are filled, the photo will be automatically saved. If the slots are not fully filled, touch the shutter button again to save the photo.
- **STOP MOTION**: Capture a number of photos of a certain scene, then convert them into a speeded-up video.

### Settings

Touch  to set more options:

- **Photo size**: Touch to select photo size.
- **Video quality**: Touch to select video progressive scan output and definition.
- **Volume button function**: Touch to customize the Volume button to either Shutter, Zoom, Volume or Quick Snap when using camera.
- **Touch to capture**: Touch to turn on/off. When activated, the image will be captured by simply touching the viewfinder screen.
- **Grid**: Touch to turn on/off. It divides the screen into equal parts and helps you take better photos by making it simple to align elements such as the horizon or buildings, to the lines in the grid.
- **Storage**: Touch to choose between phone and SD card storage when an SD card is inserted. The default is phone storage.


- **Save location information**: Turn on  to tag photos and videos with your location. This option is available when the GPS location service is enabled.
- **Shutter sound**: Touch to turn on/off shutter sound when capturing.
- **Spirit level**: Enable Spirit level to display a guiding line on the viewfinder to help you take better photos.
- **Reset settings**: Touch to reset the camera to its factory default settings.

## 2.2 Gallery



Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and play videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for selection.

To view the photos you have taken, touch  from the Home screen.



① Touch to access more options

② Photos

View the photos/videos you have just taken

③ Folders

Photos, videos, screenshots, etc. are all automatically grouped in Folders


## Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Find the picture you want to work on, and touch the picture in the full-screen picture view.



- Touch  to share the picture.
- Touch  to auto-edit.




- Touch  to edit the picture.
- ① Rotate
- ② Crop
- ③ Discard changes
- ④ Save changes
  - Touch  to delete the picture.
  - Touch  to set the picture as your favorite.
  - Touch  > Info to see more information of the picture or Use as to set the picture as a Contact photo or Wallpaper.

## Folders management

When there are many pictures and videos, you can manage your folders for convenient viewing.

- Create a folder



Touch > New folder to create and name a new folder. Select the pictures or videos you want to include in it and touch **Copy** or **Move** to copy or move them.

- Move/copy pictures or videos

Touch and hold the picture(s) or video(s) you want to move/copy. Touch > **Move to folder/Copy to folder**, then select the folder that you want to move to/copy to.

- Delete or recover pictures or videos

Touch and hold the picture(s) or video(s) you want to delete, and touch .

Deleted items will be retained in **Bin** for 30 days, after which they will be permanently deleted. To permanently delete them within this period, find the picture(s) or video(s) in **Bin** and touch and hold to delete.


To recover the picture(s) or video(s) within this period, touch and hold the picture(s) or video(s) in **Bin** and touch **Restore** to recover.

## 2.3 Music



You can play music files stored on your phone or microSD card.

To play a music file, swipe up on the Home screen, then touch Music .



- 1 More options
- 2 Search for a song
- 3 Play or pause
- 4 Play the next song
- 5 Music settings

While playing songs with Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.



# 3 Apps and features

## 3.1 Phone



### Making a call

To make a call, touch  in the Favorites tray.



Enter the desired number from the dial pad and touch  to place the call or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call logs** by sliding or touching tabs, then make the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching **Create new** or **Add to existing**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up a call, touch .


### International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold  to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and touch .

### Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch  to make an emergency call. Depending on your network and country this could even work without a SIM card and without typing in the SIM PIN code.

## Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call:

- Swipe right the icon  to answer;
- Swipe left the icon  to reject;
- Touch  to reject the call by sending a preset message.

## Calling your voicemail


Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold .

If you receive a voicemail,  appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New voicemail**.

## During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



-  End the current call.
-  Switch to video call.
-  Make another call.
-  Display the dial pad.
-  Touch for more options.
-  Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
-  Touch to record.
-  Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
-  Merge calls to start a conference call.
-  Swap the calls.



To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

## Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

### Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the  icon to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

### Conference calls<sup>(1)</sup>

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch  to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch . You can also add participants from **Call logs** or **Contacts**.
- Touch  to start the conference.
- Touch  to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

### Call settings

Touch  from the **Phone** screen, then touch **Settings** to set phone and contact settings.

### Call log

You can access your call logs by touching  from the **Phone** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch one call to view information or further operations. You can launch a new call, send a message to the contact or number, or view detailed information of the call.

To delete the call history of a selected contact or number, touch and hold the contact and choose **Delete**.

## 3.2 Contacts




**Contacts** enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

### Consult your Contacts

To see your contacts, touch  from the App drawer.



- Touch to open the Quick contact panel
- Touch and hold to share or delete the selected contact

 Add new contact




Deleted contacts will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

## Adding a contact

Touch  in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.



## Add to/remove from Favorites <sup>(1)</sup>

To add a contact to favorites, you can enter **Phone** app > **Favorites screen**, click **ADD A FAVORITE** to add contact to favorites.

To remove a contact from favorites, touch  on the contact details screen.


## Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch  in the contact details screen.

When finished, touch .

## Using the Quick contact panel

Touch a contact to open the Quick contact panel.



- Touch the number to make a call.
- Touch  to send a message.
- Touch  to make a video call.

The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

## Sharing contacts

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

- From the Contacts screen, touch and hold a contact and touch **Share**.
- Select the application to perform this action.

<sup>(1)</sup> Phone and Gmail contacts can be added to favorites.

### 3.3 Messages .....




#### Writing a new message

You can create, edit, send and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

To access Messages, touch from the App drawer.

On the message list screen, touch to write text/multimedia messages.



#### Sending a text message

- To add recipients, enter a mobile phone number or select a contact in the **To** bar.
- Touch the **Text message** bar to enter the text of the message.
- When finished, touch to send the text message.



Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

#### Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and contacts to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.


- To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **To** bar.
- Write the text of the message in the **Text message** bar.
- Touch to give access to your location, send a voice message or attach files.
- Touch to take a photo/video or attach a photo/video you have taken.
- When finished, touch to send the multimedia message.

#### Manage messages

When receiving a message, will appear on the Status bar as a notification. Drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the **Messages** application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:



① Touch for more options

② Touch to call the number

③ Touch to save the number to Contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved

To adjust message settings, touch  and select **Settings** on the message list screen.

## 3.4 Calendar



Use **Calendar** to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, open the Google apps folder from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

### Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by **Schedule**, **Day**, **3 days**, **Week**, or **Month**, touch  to select.

### To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch .
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can turn on **All-day** .
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch **Save** at the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the **Week** view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area which will then turn into , then touch the icon to create the new event.

### To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen. Touch  to edit the event, or touch  > **Delete** to delete.

### Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon  will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the notification panel, touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list. Touch the **Back** button to close and exit.

## 3.5 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, swipe up the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

### Alarm

From the Clock screen, touch **Alarm** to enter.

- Turn on  to enable the alarm.
- Touch  to add a new alarm, touch  to save.
- Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.
- Touch **DELETE** to delete the selected alarm.


### Clock

To view the date and time, touch **Clock**.

- Touch  to add a city from the list.

## Timer


From the Clock screen, touch **Timer** to enter.



- Set the time.
- Touch  to start the countdown.
- Touch  to pause.
- Touch  to reset.

## Stopwatch

From the Clock screen, touch **Stopwatch** to enter.




- Touch  to start the Stopwatch.
- Touch  to show a list of records according to the updated time.
- Touch  to pause.
- Touch  to reset.
- Touch  to share.

## Adjust Clock settings

Touch  to access Clock and Alarm settings.

## 3.6 Calculator

To solve mathematical problems with **Calculator**, swipe up from the Home screen, then touch .



- ① More options
- ② Touch to switch between Basic calculation and Scientific calculation
- ③ Touch to view calculation history

## 3.7 TCL app



### Sound Recorder



Use this function to record audio files. The phone support WAV, MP3, AAC, AMR, MIDI, Vorbis, AAC+, and FLAC. The recording file you stopped will be stored in audio file automatically.

## 3.8 Other applications <sup>(1)</sup>

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To download and install more 3rd party applications, use the Google Play Store application.

### 3.9 Google applications

Google apps are preinstalled on your phone to improve work efficiency and help you enjoy life.

This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to the related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google account to enjoy all the functions.

#### Google Go

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices on which the browser is installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

A web browser with which you can surf the internet.

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronized with your Google account.

<sup>(1)</sup> Application availability depends on country and carrier.

## Gmail

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account.

## Maps

Google Maps offers satellite imagery, street maps, 360° panoramic views of streets, real-time traffic conditions, and route planning for travelling by foot, car, or public transportation. By using this application, you can find your own location, search for a place, and get suggested route planning for your trips.

## YouTube

YouTube is an online video-sharing application where users can upload, view, and share videos. Available content includes video clips, TV clips, music videos, and other content such as video blogging, short original videos, and educational videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the internet.

## Play Store

Serves as the official app store for the Android operating system, allowing users to browse and download applications and games. Applications are either free of charge or at a cost.

In Play Store, search for the app you need, download it and then follow the installation guide to install the app. You can also uninstall, update an app, and manage your downloads.

## Duo

A video chat mobile app.

With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.

## Files

Files displays all data stored on the phone, including both external SD card and internal storage, such as applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; Videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

## Drive

A file storage and synchronization service created by Google, which allows users to store files in the cloud, share and edit files.

Files in Drive are kept secure and can be accessed from any device by logging in to your Google account. Files or folders can be shared privately with other Google account users.

## 4 Settings



To go to **Settings**, swipe up from the Home screen and then touch .

You can also swipe down from the notification panel and touch .

### 4.1 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch **Settings > Wi-Fi**.
- Turn on .
- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network carrier for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you can add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch **Settings > Wi-Fi > Add network**.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch **Connect**.

#### To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connection to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- On the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch **FORGET** in the dialog that opens.

### 4.2 Bluetooth <sup>(1)</sup>

#### Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

#### To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch **Settings > Bluetooth**.
- Turn on .

Your device name will appear on screen.

#### To rename your device

- Touch **Settings > Bluetooth**.
- Touch **Device name**.
- Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.

#### To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch **Settings > Bluetooth > + Pair new device**.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to pair your phone with in the list.
- In the dialog that pops up, touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will be connected to the device.

#### To unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch  beside the device you want to unpair from.
- Touch **FORGET** to confirm.

<sup>(1)</sup> You are recommended to use TCL Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with your phone. You can go to <https://www.tcl.com> for more information about the TCL Bluetooth headset.

## 4.3 SIM card & cellular network

Go to **Settings > SIM card & cellular network > SIM card settings > SIM 1 > Roaming Mode** to enable data roaming, set your preferred network type, check the network connection you are using or create a new access point, etc.

### SIM cards <sup>(1)</sup>

Touch to choose SIM 1 or SIM 2 for connecting to the network, making calls and sending SMS messages.

### Data usage

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: 2G, 3G or 4G.

If the network is not connected, you can turn on cellular data in **Settings > SIM card & cellular network > Data usage**.

### Data saver

By enabling Data saver, you can reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

### Cellular data

If you do not need to transmit data on cellular networks, turn off **Cellular data** to avoid incurring significant charges for data use on local carrier cellular networks, particularly if you do not have a cellular data agreement.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently.

### App data usage

Touch to review the data usage of each app.



Carrier data accounting may differ from device accounting.

### Billing cycle

Touch to set the cellular data usage cycle.

<sup>(1)</sup> Dual SIM only.

### Wi-Fi data usage

Touch to review Wi-Fi data usage.

### Network restrictions

You can set metered Wi-Fi networks.

Metered networks are treated like cellular networks when background data is restricted. Apps may warn before using these networks for large downloads.

### Airplane mode

Turn on **Airplane mode**  to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

### Hotspot & tethering

To share your phone's data connection via Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and USB, or as a mobile hotspot, go to **Settings > SIM card & cellular network > Hotspot & tethering** to activate these functions.

#### To rename or secure your mobile hotspot

When your mobile hotspot is activated, you can rename your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Touch **Settings > SIM card & cellular network > Hotspot & tethering > Mobile hotspot**.
- Touch **Hotspot name** to rename the network SSID or touch **Security** to set your network security.
- Touch **OK**.



The functions above may incur additional network charges from your network carrier. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

### Private DNS

Touch to select private DNS mode.

## 4.4 Connected devices

### VPN

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

#### To add a VPN

- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > VPN** and then touch .
- On the screen that opens, follow your network administrator's instructions to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch **SAVE**.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a screen lock for your phone.

#### To connect to/disconnect from VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > VPN**.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect from a VPN:

- Touch the VPN you want to disconnect from. In the dialog that opens, touch **DISCONNECT**.

#### To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch **Settings > Connected devices > VPN**.
- The VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the  icon next to the VPN you want to edit.

- After editing, touch **SAVE**.

To delete a VPN:

- Touch the  icon next to the selected VPN, then touch **FORGET** to delete it.

### USB connection

With a USB cable, you can charge your device, transfer files or photos (MTP/PTP) between your phone and a computer.

#### To connect your phone to the computer

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and choose the way which you want to transfer files or touch **Settings > Connected devices > USB connection** to select. By default, **Charge this device** is selected.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

### Printing

Touch **Printing** to activate **Print services**. You can select your **Default print service**.

### Nearby Share

The device location setting need to be on for Bluetooth and Wi-Fi to detect nearby devices.

## 4.5 Home screen & lock screen

With this menu, set your home apps, choose your favorite wallpapers and theme styles, etc.

## 4.6 Display

### Brightness level

Adjust screen brightness manually.

### Dark mode

Empty screen space will become black in this mode, making it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light.

### Eye comfort mode

**Eye comfort mode** can effectively reduce blue light radiation and adjust the color temperature to relieve eye fatigue. You can also create a custom schedule to turn it on.

### Reading mode

Screen will become monochromic to imitate physical books in this mode.

### Sleep

Set screen timeout.

### Font size

Adjust font size manually.

### Auto-rotate screen

Select whether the screen rotates automatically or not.

### Status bar & notch

With this menu, you can set the style of the status bar, turn on/off to show network speed, select whether notification icons are folded and how the battery percentage is displayed

Turn on the notch for full screen apps to get the best experience on the phone.

## More display settings

### Screen saver

To set Colors as your screen saver.

### Full screen apps

Most applications installed on the phone will automatically adapt to the full screen display without setting them manually.

For the applications which do not automatically adapt to the full screen display, you can go to **Settings > Display > More display settings > Full screen apps** to set.

## 4.7 Sound & vibration

Use the Sound settings to configure many aspects of call ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

### Silent mode

Touch  to turn on silent mode.

### Phone ringtone & vibrate

Set your incoming call ringtone or opt for the phone to vibrate only.

### Notification ringtone

Set the default sound for notifications.

### Alarm ringtone

Set your alarm ringtone.

### Do Not Disturb

If you do not want to be disturbed by your phone or information ringtones during work or rest, you can set the **Do Not Disturb** mode.

Swipe down the Status bar twice to access the Quick Settings panel and touch  to turn on Do Not Disturb.

## Headset mode

Ringtone will only be heard from headset if it is plugged in.

## More sound settings

Set dial pad tones, screen locking sounds, touch sounds, etc.

## 4.8 Notifications

In the Notifications menu, you can configure whether to block the notifications from this app, hide sensitive content, etc.

## 4.9 Button & gestures

### Gestures

To set some gestures for convenient use, such as flip to mute , 3-finger screenshot, take photo/video, etc

### Power key

Touch to set **Quick launch camera** and **Power button ends call**.

## 4.10 Smart Manager

**Smart Manager** ensures your phone is operating in top form by automatically scanning and optimizing data usage to preserve battery levels, manage storage and protect against security threats.

Restricting auto-start apps can make the system run faster and extend battery life.

You can also do some options manually for further optimization.

## 4.11 Security & biometrics

### Screen lock

Select one method such as **Swipe**, **Pattern**, **PIN**, or **Password** to unlock the screen.

## Fingerprint

Use your Fingerprint to unlock the screen.

Access **Settings > Security & biometrics > Fingerprint** to activate these functions.

## Face unlock

**Face unlock** allows you to unlock your device with your facial data. Set it according to the on-screen steps.

Ensure that you are facing the phone screen when using face recognition.

**NOTE:** you need to set a pattern, PIN, or password before using face key.

## Smart Lock

**Smart Lock** keeps your device unlocked when it's safe with you and locked when it detects that it's been put down.

## Others

You can also set **Quick assistance**, **Device admin apps**, **SIM card lock**, **Encryption & credentials**, **Trust agents**, etc. in **Settings > Security & biometrics**.

## 4.12 Location

Touch to set whether to allow an app to access your device's location. You can set to allow continual access, or only while the app is in use.

## 4.13 Privacy

To protect your privacy, you can set an app to be allowed or forbidden access to your location, SMS, phone, etc. Also whether or not to show passwords, choose the activities and info that you want Google to save.

## 4.14 Apps

Touch to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data usage or force them to stop.

In the **Permission manager** menu of an application, you can grant permissions for the app, such as allowing the app to access your **Camera**, **Contacts**, **Location**, etc.

In the **Special app access** menu, you can set **Battery optimization**, **Device admin apps**, **Do Not Disturb access**, **Notification access**, **Wi-Fi control**, etc.

## 4.15 Storage

Enter **Settings > Storage** to check the usage of storage space and free up more when necessary.

## 4.16 Accounts

Touch to add, remove, and manage your email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control the options for how all applications send, receive and synchronize data; i.e. if this is done automatically, according to a schedule for each app, or not at all.

Touch **Add account** to add an account for the selected app.

## 4.17 Digital Wellbeing and parental controls

In this menu you can find how much time you have spent on the phone and even on each app. You can customize the time limit for using the phone to ensure a healthy and balanced life.

In addition, parents are able to restrict their children's usage time to manage their browsing habits.

## 4.18 Google

Touch to configure your Google account and service settings.

## 4.19 Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

## 4.20 System

### About phone

View basic information for your phone such as model name, CPU, camera, resolution, etc.

You can also check legal information, build number, status and other specs.

### System Update

If you want to update the system, touch **CHECK FOR UPDATES** (refer to "5 Making the most of your phone > FOTA upgrade").

### Update Apps

Check app update information.

### Languages & input

Touch to configure language settings, the on-screen keyboard, voice input settings, pointer speed, etc.

### Date & time

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.

### Backup

Turn on  to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up will be restored onto the new phone when you sign in with your Google account.

## Reset

Touch to reset all network settings and app preferences, you won't lose your data with these settings.

If **Factory data reset** is selected, all data in your phone's internal storage will be erased, please back up your data before reset.

## Regulatory & safety

Touch to view product information such as **Product model**, **Manufacturer name**, **Manufacturer address**, **IMEI**, **CU reference**, **Bluetooth Declaration ID**, etc.

## User Experience Improvement Program

Touch to join the User Experience Improvement Program so we can continue to improve our product design and overall user experience.

# 5 Making the most of your phone

## FOTA upgrade

Use the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) upgrade to update your phone's software.

To access updates, from the app list, touch **Settings > System > System Update**. Turn on data connection or Wi-Fi before searching for updates.

With Wi-Fi turned on, the system is able to discover if a new firmware version is available and if so, begin to download it automatically. Once finished, a pop up dialog will give you the option of updating your phone now or later.

If **Settings > System > System Update > :** > **Settings > Automatically download** is turned off, you will only receive a notification which will appear in the Status bar.

During FOTA downloading or updating, to avoid errors in locating the correct update packages, do not change your default storage location.

After FOTA update completely, it need restart device, it will prompt tips to restart device

## 6 Troubleshooting

Before contacting the service center, here are some instructions to help you troubleshoot your device:

- For optimal operation, fully charge the battery.
- To improve the phone's performance, remove unnecessary files or apps on your phone.
- Update your phone's software via **Settings > System > System Update**.
- Reset your phone via **Settings > System > Reset > Factory data reset**. Another method is to hold down the **Power** key and the **Volume up** key at the same time when your phone is powered off. Release the power button and then the volume button after the vibration, then select **Wipe data / factory reset > Factory data reset** to reset. All your phone data will be lost permanently. It is strongly advised to fully back up your phone data before resetting.

and carry out the following checks:

### My phone can't be switched on or is frozen

- When the phone can't be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed. Then switch it on again.
- When the phone falls into a loop during power on animation and the user interface can't be accessed, press and hold the **Power** key to reset. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by third party applications.
- If neither method is effective, reset the phone by pressing the **Power** key and the **Volume up** key at the same time. Release the power key when the device vibrates, then select **Wipe data / factory reset > Factory data reset** to reset.

### My phone has not responded for several minutes

- If your phone doesn't respond, turn off your phone by pressing and holding the **Power** key until it turns off and then restart it again.
- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone.

### My phone turns off by itself

- Check that your screen is locked when you are not using your phone, and make sure that the **Power** key is not accidentally pressed while the screen is unlocked.
- Check the battery charge level.

- If it still doesn't work, reset the phone or update software.

### My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the TCL charger that comes with the phone.
- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been empty for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.
- Make sure that charging is carried out under normal conditions 0°C (32°F) to 45°C (113°F).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

### My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

- Try connecting to the network by moving to another physical location.
- Verify the network coverage with your carrier.
- Check with your carrier that your SIM card is valid.
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded.

### My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that the internet access service of your SIM card is available.
- Check your phone's internet connection settings.
- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

### Invalid SIM card

- Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted.
- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card is available.

### My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialed a valid number and have touched .
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.

- Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

#### **My phone can't receive incoming calls**

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network).
- Check your subscription status with your carrier (credit, SIM card valid, etc.).
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

#### **The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received**

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your carrier.
- Your caller may have concealed his name or number.

#### **I can't find my contacts**

- Make sure that your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure that your SIM card is inserted properly.

#### **The sound quality of the calls is poor**

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the **Volume** key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with stronger signal strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector and speaker on your phone are clean.

#### **I can't use the features described in the manual**

- Check with your carrier to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require a TCL accessory.

#### **When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialed**

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your contacts.
- Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

#### **I can't add a contact**

- Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some contacts or save the contacts to the phone.

#### **My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact your network carrier to check service availability.

#### **I can't access my voicemail**

- Make sure that your carrier's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voicemail number".
- Try later if the network is busy.

#### **I can't send and receive MMS**

- Check your phone storage as it might be full.
- Contact your network carrier to check service availability and MMS parameters.
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your carrier.
- The server center may be swamped. Try again later.

#### **SIM card PIN locked**

- Contact your network carrier to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

#### **I can't connect my phone to my computer**

- Check to make sure the USB port is not broken. If it's not working, try another USB port on your computer.
- Make sure USB drivers are properly installed.
- If you are using a Windows computer, make sure it supports MTP mode. If you are using a Mac, make sure to install Android File Transfer from [www.android.com/filetransfer/](http://www.android.com/filetransfer/).

#### **I can't download new files**

- Make sure that there is sufficient phone storage space for your download.
- Select the microSD card as the location to store downloaded files.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.

### **The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth**

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two phones are within Bluetooth's detection range.

### **The battery drains too fast**

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 120 minutes).
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication.
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running applications if they are not being used for extended periods of time.
- Turn off Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, or GPS when not in use.

### **The phone becomes warm following prolonged calls, game playing, internet surfing or running other complex applications**

- This heating is a normal consequence of the CPU handling excessive data. Ending the above actions will make your phone return to normal temperature.

### **After a factory data reset is performed, I can't use my phone without entering Google account credentials**

- After a reset is performed, you must enter the original Google account credentials that were used on this phone.
- If you don't remember your Google account credentials, complete Google account recovery procedures.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.

### **I forgot some passwords/codes/keys on my phone**

- Perform a factory data reset.
- If you still cannot access your phone, apply to the authorized repair center, but remember that it will not be regarded as a warranty case.

### **How to back up my device data**

- Go to **Settings > System > Backup** (refer to "4.20 System > Backup" )
- You can also back up your data to another phone via the **Switch Phone** app. Swipe up the Home screen to find the search bar and enter **Switch Phone**, transfer data by following the instructions.
